Personal Development	In Year 10, pupils will study key theological beliefs that underpin Christianity, they will compare these to the beliefs within other religions on the same issues. Pupils will read, analyse and annotate encyclicals written by Popes over the years. Pupils will make cross curricular links when looking at natural evil including natural disasters. Pupils will explore the historical facts regarding the person of Jesus to decide which religious view is the most accurate. Pupils will look at case studies of different religious pilgrimages that take place around the world. Through learning about crime and sin, pupils will understand the different types of punishments used around the world and the laws regarding these punishments. Pupils will link their learning in RE to Art, as they study the architecture of the Catholic Church and the use of statues & sculptures in religion. Pupils will explore the concept of vocation as they understand how people have responded to their vocations through the sacraments and the call to evangelisation. Pupils will also evaluate the place of religion in a multicultural UK society.
